Hello Neighbour,

The summer has seen a great deal of progress here at South Molton!

We are now looking ahead to September and continuing forward with this momentum.

Progress So Far

North Block

- The ground floor slab is complete.
- Structural works to the existing façade along Davies Mews have commenced.
- The superstructure core has now been poured to the highest level.

South Block

- 85% of the ground floor slab has been poured.
- Structural reinforcement works now complete at Basement 1 level.
- The superstructure core has also now been poured to the highest level.

50-54 Davies Street

- In the Running Horse Pub, restoration works are ongoing with floor strengthening and lintel replacement works showing significant progress.
- The final demolition process has started in 52-54 Davies Street which sees the removal of levels 2 and 3 in the building.

Planned works for this month

- In the North Block we prepare for the commencement of the steel superstructure. This includes the dismantle of the Jumpform rig and the installation of the steel embedment plates.
- After the completion of the ground floor slab in the South Block, the Jumpform rig will follow the North in being dismantled. Restoration works to the Brook Street façade will also continue.
- Structural alteration works continue throughout the Running Horse Pub. The remaining demolition activities in 52-54 Davies Street are set to continue throughout September.

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
- Progress so far
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Did you know?

The Peri Jumpform system allows formwork to climb automatically as the concrete structure rises, unlike a traditional jumpform that must be lifted by crane.

This innovative climbing formwork is supported by hydraulic jacks that move the formwork upwards step-by-step, providing a safer, more efficient method for constructing vertical concrete elements.

By reducing reliance on cranes, the Peri Jumpform system not only accelerates the construction programme but also significantly enhances site safety- reflecting Skanska's commitment to delivering projects with the highest standards of quality, innovation and care for our people and communities.

What's been happening in August

August has been yet again another busy month on site, with lots of progress made. Here's a quick roundup:

- New structural terrace steels and joists have been installed at the back of unit 22
- New steels installed for plant support on roof of 20
- Roof structural repair works on 21 and 22 complete
- Mechanical tanks installed in the basement of 22 to form the new plant room
- ▶ Temporary works installed in South Molton Passage
- Drylining 1st fix of partition walls in unit 10
- Temporary works to rear of 17 for new structural steel and steel install is ongoing
- ▶ Mechanical & Electrical 1st fix is ongoing in units 15-18
- Roof works ongoing at unit 10

What's planned for September

- Mechanical & Electrical 1st fix to commence in units 20 and 22
- Next phase of temporary works install and demolition in 23 and 24
- ► The completion of the roof on 10 and further roof works on 21, 22 and 24 SMS
- Drylining 1st fix of partition walls in units 20 and 22
- ▶ Firestopping for units 15-18

Project highlight:

19/20 Micro Retail Unit SML

During August, we began forming a new retail unit on South Molton Lane as part of our plan to create compact 'micro units' behind several South Molton Street properties.

At the rear of 19 and 20 SMS, we removed the dividing wall and lowered the floor level with a new concrete slab to match the street level in the Lane. A new wall was built to separate the unit from the existing property, and steel beams were installed to support a mezzanine level.

In September, timber joists and a ceiling will be added to complete the mezzanine floor, shaping what will be a new micro retail unit with its own entrance on South Molton Lane.

Thames Water works Dates

Thames Water will be carrying out a disconnection of existing water supplies on units 15-22 from 27th October - 8th November. Thames Water need to excavate on South Molton Street, outside the Curo hoarding line.

There will be a temporary road closure put in place for the duration of the works. Pedestrian access will be maintained for the duration of the work, but the road closure will likely disrupt deliveries. Curo logistics team will aid where they can in assisting deliveries onto the street during the period.

Curo will advise when the disconnection to the remaining units (phase 2) will take place once confirmed by Thames Water. This will likely be in Q1 2026.

New Roof and Dormers for 22

In August we rebuilt the timber frame roof in unit 22, creating a new mansard and dormers on the SMS elevation of the roof. The rear section of the roof remains intact and has been structurally strengthened by doubling the rafters.

The next step of the roof build will include lead dressing of the Dormers and valley gutters, before the roof is tiled and made watertight.
